Pupil voice

Many young people care about environmental sustainability. Stakeholder engagement is a core function of governance and listening to pupils' views is essential in ensuring they feel valued.

Global citizens

Schools have a crucial role in help ing young people to understand the world and develop skills and attitudes to live fulfilled lives as responsible citizens who are aware of , and helping to combat , global issues .

Net zero

This includes appointing school/trust leaders responsible for sustainability and the development of school /trust climate action plans.

At a local level, governors and trustees can lead change. It is a core function of boards to determine the values, vision, ethos, and strategic priorities of the school or trust it governs. Governing boards are in a position to consider their role in environmental sustainability and ensure that their trusts and schools take action.
